The **Quincy Historical Society** wants your input for its next level of development and community activities.

**Here's what has been done:** The Society organized in 2008 as an educational non-profit recognized by the State of Michigan and Federal authority. Home tours in conjunction with the Branch County Historical Society in 2009. In 2010 the Quincy Historical Museum opened in the old church on East Jefferson Street. The Society organized the first Quincy *DAZE* car show which continues to be a success under the direction of a local car club. It is now entering its 13<sup>th</sup> year.

**This is what the Society continues to do:** The museum is open the first Saturday of each month, 10 a.m. to 12 noon from May to October, the evening of Quincy Lights, and by appointment for group tours. Monthly public meetings are held at Village Hall at 6:30 p.m. on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of the month January to November (except April). The annual meeting is held in April at the United Methodist Church. Annual Preservation Awards recognize community members for their efforts to preserve historic buildings, artifacts and historic information. Historic photo calendars are published annually to enhance appreciation of our local heritage. A scholarship has been established for Quincy High School seniors to inspire in our next generation an interest and appreciation of our local history. Articles of historic interest are submitted to the local newspaper and the Quincy Library newsletter to reach a greater audience. We have formed a network of cooperation with other local historical societies.
